语言培训

学校通常要求进行这种测试,以确保你能够理解学术和专业环境中的内容、材料和语言。普通对话语言与学术用语大相径庭,因此准备这项测试是非常有帮助的。

额外福利:以下是语言培训的最新更新!

雅思考试相关资讯:

雅思考试的模块顺序有些变化,但模式不变。雅思考试的顺序如下:

- 纸质雅思考试的顺序是写作、听力和阅读。
- 计算机雅思考试的顺序为听力、阅读和写作。

在这两种情况下,口语考试可安排在其他考试之前或 之后一周。

<u>请参考雅思官方资源或与考试中心核实,以获得最准</u>确的信息。

自2023年3月起,雅思考试引入"一技重考"政策。如果学生的第一次考试成绩低于目标分数,他们可以选择重考雅思考试的一个部分。这样,如果考生需要提高某一方面的能力,就可以重考任何一个部分(听力、阅读、写作或口语),而无需重考全部四个部分。这适用于雅思学术类考试和普通培训类考试。

但是,要获得 "单项技能重考 "的资格,你必须满足以下要求:

- 你已在提供雅思 "一技重考 "服务的中心完成了一次完整考试。
- 你的完整考试为计算机雅思考试。
- 你在雅思全科考试后60天内参加雅思"一技重考"。

<u>请注意,"一技重考" 的价格可能会有所不同,因此建</u> <u>议你联系当地的考试中心了解更多信息。这项政策是</u> 学生发挥潜能、充分展示英语能力的绝佳机会。





IRCC 相关:

加拿大移民、难民和公民部(IRCC)宣布将接受学生直通车(SDS)申请人参加的四项新考试的语言测试结果。新的测试包括:

- 思培普通
- 凯尔考试
- 培生学术
- 托福网考

这一变更从 2023 年 8 月 10 日起生效。所有考试成绩都必须证明考生在口语、听力、阅读和写作方面的能力。

以下是每项考试的最低分数要求:

- <u>思培普通</u>: 测试必须在四项语言能力中的每种能力都达到相当于加拿大语言基准分数7分以上。
- 凯尔考试和培生学术:至少60分。
- 托福网考: 至少83分。

<u>请注意,学生必须亲自参加这些测试。SDS 不接受申请人参加在线远程监考。在此变更之前,</u> 雅思(IELTS)普通类和雅思(IELTS)学术类考试是IRCC唯一批准SDS申请人参加的考试。

SDS 为来自一些特定国家的学生提供快速办理学习许可的服务。所有符合 SDS 条件的学习许可申请服务标准时间为 20 天。这一变化对于希望在加拿大学习的国际留学生来说是一个重大进展。请参考雅思官方资源或与考试中心核实,以获得最准确的信息。





找工作

办理 SIN 卡

在加拿大工作需要社会保险号 (SIN)。所有留学生都应在抵达时申请一个社保号。

以下是留学生在加拿大申请社保号 SIN 的步骤:

加拿大身份证明和身份状态:

你必须提供一份有效的主要文件,以证明你在加拿大的身份和状态。对于国际留学生而言,这可以是 注明你在加拿大 "可以接受就业 "或 "可以工作 "的学习许可。

在营业时间内抵达多伦多皮尔逊机场的学生可以在离开机场前获得社会保险号 (SIN)。机场内设有加 拿大服务局中心,因此无需申请。你可以填写一份表格来获取新的 SIN,几分钟内即可当场收到你的 SIN。申请 SIN 无需付费。如果你无法在机场获得你的 SIN,你可以在线申请、邮寄或亲自到你附近 的加拿大服务中心申请。

申请:

你可以通过三种方式申请 SIN:

- 。 **在线申请:** 你可以在线申请,安全上 传电子文件,如果符合条件,还可以 在申请处理完毕后在线查看你的 SINo
- 。 **亲自申请:** 前往最近的加拿大服务局 办公室。记得带上你的文件原件前往 办理。
- **邮寄**: 如果你的居住地距离最近的加 拿大服务处办公室 100 公里或以上, 你可以邮寄申请。

审理: 申请处理完毕后,你将通过信函收到 你的 SIN。

请注意,由于 COVID-19 大流行,申请流程 也可能会有所改变。请随时查看加拿大服务 局官方网站,了解最新信息。







请记住,你的 SIN 是保密的,应受到保护。除非你确认在法律层面上,对方有权索要你的社保号, 否则不要将其提供给任何人。

志愿者服务和实习

志愿者服务是为一个共同目标或一个组织无偿奉献时间和劳动的行为。这是获得专业经验、技能和知识的好方法,可为你将来在加拿大就业做好准备。当你很忙碌的时候,做志愿者或实习似乎是在浪费时间,然而,在加拿大学习和工作期间,做志愿者和实习是必不可少的。

虚拟志愿者服务和远程实习:

随着 COVID-19 的流行,加拿大的许多组织和公司都将其志愿者服务机会和实习机会转移到了线上。这样,志愿者和实习生就可以在自己家里贡献自己的时间和技能。

基于技能的志愿者服务和基于项目的实习:

加拿大越来越多的组织正在寻找具备特定技能的志愿者。同样,一些公司也正在从传统的实习转向基于项目的实习。在这些实习中,学生在实习期间从事一个特定的项目。这让学生有机会在实习期间产生切实的影响。

社会正义志愿者服务:

在加拿大,人们对解决社会正义问题的志愿服务机会越来越感兴趣。这可能涉及与关注种族平等、LGBTQ+ 权利或气候变化等领域的组织合作。

初创企业实习:

在加拿大,学生寻求在初创企业实习的趋势越来越明显。这些实习可以提供独特的经历,因为学生往往有机会承担更多的责任,并了解企业的多个方面。

职场文化

加拿大是一个适合居住、也适合工作的好地方!无论你走到哪里,其职场文化都与你所在国家的职场 文化有很大不同。因此,有必要给大家解释一下加拿大的职场文化,并给大家列出你需要了解并考虑 的常见做法和方式,这在你决定前往加拿大工作或已经在加拿大工作的时候,都能帮助到你。

肢体语言在所有文化中都至关重要。你必须以专业和自信的姿态示人; 站得笔直,面带微笑,等等。肢体语言会给人留下深刻的印象,并为工作场所和未来的互动奠定基调。如果第一印象不好,就会给人留下不好的印象,结果也会不尽人意。

姿势:

站直可以传递自信和专业精神。懒散或驼背会给人精力不足或不感兴 趣的印象。

面部表情:

微笑可以表示友好和平易近人。不过,重要的是要确保你的面部表情 与当时所处的情形相呼应。



肢体语言

握手:

传统上来说,坚定的握手被视为自信和尊重的象征。然而,由于 COVID-19 的流行,许多人现在开始使用点头、挥手或撞肘等非接触 式的问候方式。遵循最新的公共卫生指南并尊重互动对象的舒适度始 终是个好主意。

眼神交流:

在交谈过程中保持适当的眼神交流,可以显示出你的投入和兴趣。然而,重要的是要避免盯着别人看,这会让别人感到不舒服。

个人空间:

尊重他人的个人空间非常重要。在加拿大,交谈时保持舒适的距离是 一种习惯。

请记住,第一印象会对他人如何看待你产生持久的影响。展示积极的 肢体语言有助于为今后的互动奠定积极的基调。不过,真实和尊重他 人的舒适度也很重要。







在加拿大的工作场所,着装给人留下深刻印象是非常重要的。请确保你已做过调研并了解着装要求。如有疑问,商务休闲装通常是首选。加拿大有句俗语: "为你想要的工作着装,而不是为你现有的工作着装"。工作或面试时的着装通常要避免牛仔裤和短裤,尽量穿得保守一些。始终确保面部和头发干净整洁。最后,避免使用香水和其他香料。因为有些人对香水过敏,因此大多数地方都要求避免使用香水和其他香料。请注意,由于远程工作越来越成为一种趋势,许多公司都采用了更宽松的着装要求,尤其是针对在家工作的员工,更是如此。不过,最好还是和雇主确认着装要求。



个人空间

在加拿大,个人空间非常重要,尤其是在工作场所。正式打招呼或握手时,你通常可以靠得很近,但之后应尽可能保持 6 英尺的距离。请务必保持礼貌并适时洗手。由于 COVID-19 的流行,保持身体距离变得更加重要。建议遵循最新的关于保持身体距离的公共卫生指南。



眼神交流

眼神交流通常是最难掌握的技巧之一,但也可能是最重要的技巧之一。良好的目光接触可以在交谈中表现出值得信赖,并显示出对谈话很感兴趣。它展示了个人的自信。不过,良好的眼神交流和盯着人看之间有一条微妙的界限。盯着人看会让人感到不舒服。记得要时不时地把目光移开。



握手

如前所述,强有力地握手可以显示你的自信,也是表明你意图的好方法。握手的时间应在 3-5 秒左右,以便快速问候和介绍自己的姓名。这样做既快速又有效。然而,公共卫生指南现在建议避免与他人亲密接触,尤其是在职场,更是如此。相反,许多人开始采用其他非接触式的问候方式,如点头、挥手或撞肘。



初次见面时,你应该用全名来介绍自己。称呼别人时通常可以使用女士或先生,但不能搞错性别。你可以随时询问他们希望被称作什么。在加拿大的工作场所,事情往往比较随意,员工和管理层之间经常直呼其名。离开和进入工作场所时,人们习惯说你好、晚安或早上好。这让工作场所更加轻松舒适。请注意,由于 COVID-19 的流行,现在很多初次见面都是通过虚拟方式进行的。确保视频和音频正常工作,并在安静、光线充足的地方参加或举行会议非常重要。





媒体使用

在加拿大,几乎所有个人和公司都使用社交媒体。公司通常使用社交 媒体发布招聘信息,推广产品和服务。不过,工作使用社交媒体和个 人使用社交媒体是要有所区分的。重要的是,在工作时间要使用工作 账户进行与工作相关的活动。要记得在个人时间内而非工作时间使用 个人社交媒体,如休息时间、午餐时间、下班后等。另外,通常的做 法是不要将移动设备放在客户面前。一些企业使用 WhatsApp 等社 交媒体实现员工或管理层群聊。这有助于换班或需要请病假的情况。 要经常查看公司政策。随着远程工作的兴起,社交媒体和数字通讯工 具的使用在加拿大工作场所变得更加普遍。即使在家工作,在这些平 台上保持专业形象也很重要。



问题

在文化上,开放的工作场所是非常普遍的。这意味着雇主会鼓励你提问和澄清疑惑。如果你不明白或需要帮助,我们强烈建议你寻求帮助。提问可以减少错误。这是一种高效、有效的职场文化习俗。

工作场所有许多标准的价值观和礼仪。以下五点虽非详尽无遗,但却 至关重要:

- 善良: 在需要时帮助他人; 说 "请 "和 "谢谢 "
- **忠诚**:品牌和公司喜欢员工的忠诚,彰显他们的产品,即使在工作之余也要表现出对品牌的热情;成为品牌大使。
- **公平**: 平等对待所有同事和客户,不要猜测任何事情; 始终尊重 他人,始终面带微笑。
- **守时:** 准时上岗; 习惯上提前 10-15 分钟到岗。这样你就有时间 安顿下来,把东西放到休息室,然后在上班时间开始工作。
- 礼貌: 始终对同事和雇主保持坦诚。如果你要迟到,请打电话告知。如果有紧急情况,请打电话沟通。雇主也是人,也理解生活中会有突发事件。当别人需要帮助时,要给予帮助,甚至为别人开门。自己的事情自己做,把干净的地方留给下一位同事。切勿妄加猜测。
- **适应能力:** 当今的工作场所变化迅速,能够适应新情况和新挑战变得越来越重要。
- **应变能力:** 从挫折中反弹并在逆境中继续前进的能力是现代职场的宝贵特质。



工作场所的价 值观和礼仪





社交

在加拿大的职场文化中,非常鼓励与同事进行社交和友好往来。团队合作、协作、团队建设和鼓舞士气都可以通过社交来实现。结识每个人都是一笔财富,但要确保在工作场所保持专业性,避免与客户或顾客进行某些话题讨论。更私人的谈话可以在休息时间或没有客户时展开。确保客户和顾客第一,永远优先于任何谈话。此外,还要习惯性地避免某些话题,如宗教、政治、闲聊他人,并避免粗言秽语。同时,众多公司向远程工作的转变也影响了职场文化。许多公司正在实施各种举措,以在虚拟环境中保持积极和包容的文化,如虚拟团队建设活动和在线社交活动。

什么是建立人脉?







建立人脉是一种积极与他人建立关系的方式,从专业角度获取知识和专业联系信息。它可以让你与该领域的专家以及在该领域拥有知识和专长的人保持联系。结识志同道合的人可以促进建立更多的个人联系(最好的朋友、配偶、合作伙伴等)。建立人脉有很多好处,包括但不限于:

- 获得愿意分享知识的专家的帮助
- 获得高质量的推荐信
- 结识你感兴趣的各个领域的专家
- 开辟多种职业机会
- 深入了解你所在的领域
- 了解你所在领域的最新情况
- 在世界不同地区获得更多影响力
- 获得人际交往技能
- 提高沟通技能

加拿大礼仪

加拿大人以友好和礼貌著称。以下是一些预期的举止:

- 加拿大人喜欢在谈话(包括商务谈话)中开轻松的玩笑。你可以轻松加入,但一定要注意场合。
- 如果你有不明白的地方,请询问清楚。询问总比装懂要好。
- 加拿大人举止轻松。在与人交流时,要记得掌控呼吸和放松。
- 守时很重要。赴约或开会时尽量提前 15 分钟到场。迟到超过 15 分钟会被视为失礼。

建立人脉的常见做法

- 自我介绍: 以坚实有力的握手开始。这是为人职业的通用标志。
- **电梯演讲:** 准备一个 1 分钟的简短摘要,介绍自己的背景、经验和目的。简明扼要,富有个性。一定要练习电梯演讲。
- 保持冷静: 深呼吸! 不要忘了,与你交流的人和你是一样的。
- 自信的肢体语言: 展现自信的肢体语言,经常微笑。这有助于缓解压力,给人留下积极的印象。
- **适应文化差异:** 加拿大是一个多元文化的国家,有许多民族文化,每个民族都有自己特有的言谈举止。试着通过观察来适应每个人的风格。这种做法称为 "镜像"。
- 跟进: 在 24-48 小时内发送跟进电子邮件或领英消息,提醒新联系人你是谁。
- 表达感激之情: 谢谢挂嘴边。加拿大人以彬彬有礼著称。一定要记得感谢别人的时间或款待。
- 拥抱错误: 如果你说错话或词不达意,不要担心。自嘲一下也无妨。我们都是人,孰能无过。
- 名片: 在参加社交活动时随身携带几张。确保你的名片是最新的,且经过专业设计。
- 着装规范: 根据场合穿着得体。在大多数专业场合,商务休闲是常规着装。
- 积极倾听: 对对方表现出真正的兴趣。提出深思熟虑的问题,并认真倾听对方的回答。
- 参加社交活动: 参加特定行业的活动、研讨会和聚会。这些都是结识志同道合的专业人士、拓展人脉的好机会。
- **志愿者服务:** 在你感兴趣的领域或组织中担任志愿者,这是结识朋友并展示你对行业热衷参与的绝佳方式。



银行业务

在加拿大留学,拥有一个银行账户至关重要。如果你目前没有准备好银行所需的所有文件和信息,办理过程有时会比较混乱和困难。因此,我们在此帮助大家提前准备!大多数银行都要求提供相同的文件,因此请务必准备好以下文件:

- 你的护照
- 你的入境文件(IMM 表格 #1442 / 1208 / 1102) 或临时居民签证(TRV)
- 在读证明(可选,但最好携带)
- 社会保险号 (SIN) 或居住证明(可选,但最好持有)
- 加拿大签证或学习许可

加拿大有许多银行可供选择。你可以访问加拿大银行家协会(<u>Canadian Bankers Association,</u> CBA)网站,就开设加拿大银行账户进行初步研究。

以下是一些可供留学生选择的银行:

道明加拿大信托(TD Canada Trust)

• 道明银行有<u>专门为留学生设计的留学生银行账户</u>和组合业务! 他们将帮助你设立最适合你作为加拿大新移民需求的银行账户。道明还提供特别计划,例如<u>道明国际学生 GIC 计</u>划。当你申请并参与道明国际学生 GIC 计划时,它可以帮助你加快学习许可的申请。

加拿大皇家银行(RBC)

• <u>加拿大皇家银行</u>为留学生提供各项福利。他们提供快捷方便的银行设置和担保信用卡。这有助于学校生活采购和建立加拿大信用记录。如需了解更多信息,请访问其银行网站。

加拿大帝国商业银行(CIBC)

丰业银行(Scotiabank)

网上银行:

大多数加拿大银行都提供网上银行服务。你可以通过电脑或移动设备管理你的资金、支付账 单、转账等。这是一种方便的财务管理方式。

移动支付应用程序:

加拿大的许多银行都有自己的移动应用程序,苹果支付Apple Pay和谷歌支付Google Pay 等服务已被广泛接受。这些应用可与你的银行账户或信用卡相连,实现轻松的非接触式支 付。

国际汇款:

如果你需要向祖国汇款,请寻找能够提供经济实惠的国际汇款服务的银行。有些银行可能会以较低的成本为学生提供这项服务。

学生信用卡:

有些银行提供专为学生设计的信用卡。而这也是在加拿大开始建立信用记录的好方法。

储蓄账户:

除了支票账户外,还可以考虑开设储蓄账户。这可以帮助你为将来的开支存钱。

银行费用:

注意银行账户的相关费用,如月费、自动取款机费和透支费。有些银行为学生提供免月费账 户。

客户服务:

选择能提供良好客户服务的银行。如果你刚开始在加拿大办理银行业务,这一点会特别有帮助。

请记住,重要的是要做好调研,选择一家适合你的银行。在开户前,不要犹豫,要多问问题,并确保你了解所有条款和条件。

建立你的加拿大信用记录

在加拿大建立良好的信用记录对于节省利息以及更容易获得手机、租房/公寓、信用额度、汽车贷款、住房抵押贷款等方面的批准至关重要。它甚至会影响你的求职。

在加拿大,负责任地使用信用卡是建立信用记录的好方法。





你的信用报告

你的信用报告是你信用记录的摘要。

你的信用报告在你首次借款或申请信贷时生成。放款人将你的账户信息发送给征信机构,也称为信用报告机构。

你的信用评分

你的信用评分是一个三位数的数字,它是来自你的信用报告中的信息。它显示了你的信用管理水平以及贷款人借 钱给你的风险程度。你的信用评分是根据你的信用报告用公式计算出来的。 请注意

- 如果你负责任地使用信贷,你就会得到分数
- 如果你在信用管理方面有问题,则会丢分。

你的信用分数会随着信用报告的更新而变化。

为什么你的信用记录很重要

它会影响你的财务状况

金融机构会查看你的信用报告和信用评分,以决定是否借钱给你。他们还会根据这些信息来决定向你收取多少借贷利息。如果你没有信用记录或信用记录不佳,你就更难获得信用卡、贷款或抵押贷款。这甚至会影响你租别墅、租公寓或找工作。如果你有良好的信用记录,你可能会获得较低的贷款利率。随着时间的推移,这可以为你节省很多钱。

它可以显示身份盗窃的迹象

你还可以使用信用报告来检查身份盗用的迹象。你应该每年至少在两个信用局各查一次。查看下以确保没有人试 图以你的名义开设信用卡或其他贷款。

留学生的其他银行业务

信用卡使用:

负责任地使用信用卡是在加拿大建立良好信用记录的重要部分。尽量每月全额付清余额,以避免支付利息并保持良好的信用记录。

防骗意识:

对潜在的诈骗和欺诈活动保持警惕。切勿向任何人透露你的个人银行信息。如果怀疑你的账户有任何欺诈活动, 请立即联系你的银行。

储蓄和投资:

可考虑探索银行提供的储蓄和投资选项。这可以帮助你实现资金的长期增长,并为未来的财务目标做好准备。

学生折扣:

有些银行为学生提供特别折扣和优惠。开户时一定要询问清楚。这些优惠可以帮助你省钱,并让你在整个银行体 验中获得最大收益。







金融知识:

利用银行和其他组织提供的资源来增加你的金融知识。了解如何有效理财是一项宝贵的技能,它将使你终生受益。

报税

对于那些在本国采用不同税制的人来说,报税似乎相当令人生畏和困惑。然而,这却是在加拿大生活和工作的重要组成部分。

留学生为什么要在加拿大报税?

出于以下几个原因,我们鼓励留学生在加拿大报税:

- 你可能有资格获得税收抵免,如 GST/HST 抵免、住房补贴和 学费/教育抵免。
- 报税可以为你省钱,你还可以收到在加拿大工作期间所缴纳税款的退税单。
- 报税有助于你在加拿大建立纳税记录,这对你未来的财务事 宜大有裨益。

你应该何时报税?

在加拿大,你通常需要每年申报一次所得税。'**报税季 '从 2 月下旬开始,到 4 月 30 日结束**。这是为上一年报税。

你可以随时申报所得税,甚至可以申报前几年的所得税,但我们鼓励你每年都在规定的时间内申报。

我们的船长将为你提供所需的知识和工具,帮助你了解甚至自行完成报税。如果你不想麻烦,我们的船长可以为你提供有偿报税指导和协助。预约咨询,减轻报税压力!

了解国际留学生在加拿大的纳税情况

居住身份:

你在加拿大的税务居民身份取决于你与加拿大的关系。这些联系可能包括在加拿大有住房、配偶或伴侣居住在加拿大,或受抚养人在加拿大。其他联系也会被考虑在内,例如在加拿大拥有房产、与加拿大有社会或经济联系、 持有加拿大驾照或护照,或在加拿大某省或地区拥有医疗保险。





海外收入:

如果你是加拿大税务居民,您需要报告你在加拿大境内外赚取的收入。如果你在其他国家工作,你的所得税申报表可能会受到加拿大与该国之间税收协定的影响。

税收优惠和抵免:

即使你没有任何收入,报税也是一个好主意。你可能有资格享受税收优惠和抵免,如 GST/HST 抵免、住房补贴和学费/教育抵免。就所得税而言,大多数持学习许可在加拿大学习的留学生都被视为加拿大居民。

报税援助:

许多大学都提供税务诊所,由志愿者帮助学生报税。请查看你所在的大学是否提供此项服务。

加拿大税务局我的账户 (CRA MyAccount):

在你提交至少一份所得税申报表并收到一份评估通知后,你可以在加拿大税务局(CRA)网站上创建一个 MyAccount(我的帐户)。这项在线服务可让你管理税务事务,并跟踪你与 CRA 的通信。

请记住,了解你在加拿大的纳税义务和权利非常重要。如果你有任何不确定的地方,不要犹豫,向税务专业人士或加拿大税务局寻求帮助。如果你对某些事情不确定,最好还是多提问。

住宿

搬到一个新国家后,寻找住处通常是首先要考虑的事情之一。价格、地点、通勤时间和生活成本都是决定居住地时需要考虑的重要因素。作为一名留学生,你很可能会根据学校所在地和就业机会来选择居住地。选择众多,因此在做出决定之前,权衡利弊是非常重要的。以下是初来乍到者在寻找住房时需要注意的一些地方。

1.学校的留学生服务

作为一名国际留学生,首先要做的就是联系你所选择的学校。每所学校通常都设有国际留学生服务处或办公室。 他们会在入学过程的各个方面提供帮助。他们通常拥有当地的资源和关系,可以帮助寻找住宿。这些服务机构还 可以帮你联系其他即将入学或已经入学的国际留学生。这些学生可以为你移居加拿大的整个过程提供宝贵的信息 和建议。有关你所选学校的详细信息,请查看学校网站或直接致电学校。

2.学校住所

每所大专院校都应为学生提供住宿选择。有时,申请学校宿舍会竞争激烈,而且通常费用较高,尤其是对国际留学生而言,更是如此。不过,它们也有一些好处:校内地点、24 小时安保和帮助。通常更容易结交朋友和参加同学联谊活动!每所学校都不尽相同,因此联系具体学校非常重要。有些学校为国际留学生提供专门的住宿选择,因此值得仔细调研。请务必牢记自己的预算,并在做出最终决定前权衡利弊。

3.寻找室友的应用程序

我们生活在一个科技含量极高的世界里,现在你的智能设备上有很多应用程序,几乎可以帮你做任何你能想到的事情。其中之一就是寻找室友。这些应用程序的工作原理类似于网上约会,不过,它不是帮你寻找爱情,而是帮你寻找室友!有许多应用程序可供选择。其中一些包括但不限于: (点击应用程序名称,查看我们关于如何使用这些平台的视频)

以下是有关这些应用程序的更多信息

- Roomster: Roomster 是一个广受欢迎的寻找室友网站。它拥有一个庞大的租户数据库,允许用户快速进行背景调查并连接社交媒体账户,这可以在寻找过程中提供一种安全感。不过,有些用户提到,它对用户不是很友好,而且你必须付费才能留言。
- Roomi: Roomi的工作原理是在你回答了关于你自己和你对室友的要求等问题后,为你匹配潜在的室友。 它使用算法为你匹配适合你的室友。与 Roomster 一样,Roomi 也允许用户进行快速背景调查并连接社交 媒体账户。
- Diggz: Diggz 是一款寻找室友的应用程序,它采用个性化搜索算法为你匹配潜在的室友1。你可以对看起来合适的室友资料表示感兴趣,如果双方都感兴趣,就会配对成功。Diggz 还允许你发送 "即时信息",以加快配对过程。所有资料都经过 Diggz 审查,以确保平台安全无诈。Diggz 已获得好评,并帮助许多人找到了合适的出租房。
- RoomEasy: RoomEasy 是一款寻找室友的应用程序,其工作原理与 Tinder (相亲软件)相似。你可以在 RoomEasy 上创建个人档案,在系统中添加个人描述标签,然后搜索室友和公寓。只要找到你感兴趣的地 点或潜在室友的资料,你就可以 "喜欢 "他们,如果他们 "喜欢 "你的资料,你们就会配对成功。

请注意,虽然这些应用程序很有帮助,但在网上结识潜在室友时一定要谨慎。一定要先在公共场合见面,并相信 自己的直觉。如果感觉不对,很可能就是不对。此外,还要注意潜在的骗局,比如在见面或看房子之前就有人向 你索要金钱。在做出任何承诺之前,最好亲自去看看公寓并见见室友。

4.脸书市场/KIJIJI

很多人都会在本地市场上发布可供出租房屋的信息。如果你还未抵达加拿大,这样做有时会很困难。根据租房者和地点的不同,价格也可能很高。确保租金在预算范围内是很重要的。对于某些人来说,独居似乎是理想的选择。如果你计划以后做出更长期的居住安排,但目前只是需要一个临时的住处,那么短期分租一个房间或地方也是一个很好的选择。因为这种方式通常会为你提供一个家具齐全的住处,让你在初来乍到时少走弯路。

对于大多数留学生来说,你的第一个住所很可能是租来的房子或公寓。<u>加拿大按揭与住房公司(CMHC)</u>可帮助你了解在加拿大作为租户所拥有的权利。

在加拿大寻找住宿的额外小贴士

了解租赁协议:

在签署任何租赁协议之前,请确保你了解所有条款和条件。如果有任何你不确定的地方,请要求说明情况。让其他人(如可信赖的朋友或家人)与你一起审阅协议可能也会有所帮助。

公用设施:

了解电费、水费和网费等公用事业费是否包含在房租中,还是需要单独支付。这可能会对你的月支出产生重大影响。

租户保险:

考虑购买租户保险,以保护你的财物免遭损坏或盗窃。这可以让你高枕无忧,尤其是当你远离家乡时,高枕无忧 显得尤为重要。

公共交通:

了解你的潜在住所附近的公共交通选择。住在公交车站或火车站附近可以让上学和去其他地方变得更加方便和实惠。







安全:

在决定居住地之前,调查一下附近地区的安全情况。你可以通过与当地人交谈、上网查询犯罪统计数据或向学校 的留学生服务部门咨询来了解具体情况。

带家具与不带家具:

有些地方是带家具的,这样可以省去购买家具的费用和麻烦。不过,带家具的公寓租金可能较高,因此在做决定 时要考虑到这一点。

室友:

与室友同住有助于降低成本,但重要的是要选择与自己合得来的室友。在选择室友时,要考虑清洁度、生活方式和学习习惯等因素。

请记住,找到合适的居住地需要时间,因此请尽早开始寻找。在没有做好调研之前,不要匆忙签订租约。

谨防加拿大租房诈骗

作为在加拿大找房的留学生,一定要警惕潜在的租房诈骗。以下是你可能会遇到的一些常见骗局:

- 1.**幽灵租房:** 在这种骗局中,骗子在广告中宣传的房产要么根本不存在,要么目前已被占用。
- 2.**劫持广告:** 骗子复制合法的租房信息,然后用自己的联系信息重新发布。
- 3. 已出租: 骗子试图收取已出租房产的费用。
- 4. 设施缺失: 房产实际上并非具备广告中所陈列的设施。
- 5. 诱饵诱骗: 骗子向潜在租户展示一处房产,然后租给他们另一处房产。
- 6. **可疑的金钱要求**: 骗子在让潜在租户看房之前或未见面的情况下就要求预付房租。
- 7.身份盗窃: 骗子利用租房申请过程窃取潜在租客的个人信息。
- 8.**虚假房地产中介服务:** 这些服务会为客户生成一份预抵押或先租后买出租房源的清单,然后要求客户支付注册费或月租费。

请记住,在寻找出租物业时,一定要核实房东或物业经理的身份,在没有看到物业之前千万不要汇款,并且要相信自己的直觉。如果感觉不对,很可能就不是那么回事。

在加拿大寻找住房时应考虑的事项

作为在加拿大寻找住房的留学生,在寻找住房时需要考虑一些因素。以下是一些可以帮助你完成这一过程的因素:

- **预算**: 在开始找房之前,先确定自己的预算。了解自己每个月能负担多少房租,有助于缩小选择范围。
- 地点: 考虑地点。有时,市中心的住房比郊区的贵。但是,住得远可能意味着交通费用更高。

- 公共住房计划: 查看你是否有资格享受公共住房计划。许多城市都有旨在帮助低收入个人和家庭、学生及老年人获得经济适用房的计划。

请记住,最重要的是找到一个符合你的预算和需求的地方。同样重要的是,在签署任何租约之前都要仔细阅读租房合同。




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在加拿大寻找经济适用房的技巧

作为加拿大的留学生,寻找负担得起的住房是你人生旅途中的重要一环。以下是一些提示,可帮助你顺利完成这一过程:

- **确定预算**: 在开始寻找之前,先确定你的每月住房预算。这将帮助你缩小选择范围,重点关注价格在你预算范围内的住房。
- 考虑校内住房: 加拿大许多大专院校都在校内提供学生宿舍。这些学生宿舍通常都配有家具,而且离你的班级很近,因此是一个很方便的选择。校内住宿也是与其他学生见面和建立联系的好方式。
- 探索校外住宿: 大一结束后,很多学生会选择住在校外。住所可以是公寓、别墅等。请务必比较价格,并考虑距离校园和公共交通等因素。
- **寄宿家庭选择:** 与寄宿家庭同住是一种经济实惠的选择。一些学院和大学与愿意接待学生的当地家庭有联系。
- 短期家具租赁: 如果你还没有准备好长期租房,可以 考虑短期带家具租房。这些房屋的月租金通常较高, 但如果你还在探索自己的选择,这也是一个不错的选 择。



考取驾照



毕业后工作许可 (PGWP) 计划

该计划允许国际毕业生获得开放式工作许可,以获得宝贵的加拿大工作经验。自 2023 年 4 月 6 日起,PGWP 持有者如果希望在加拿大逗留更长时间,可以选择申请便利辅助流程来延长其工作许可。

申请时间线

毕业生必须在从院校获得最终成绩后 180 天内申请 PGWP。学习许可证必须在这 180 天内的某个时间有效,才有资格申请 PGWP。

课程时长

- 在学习期间,你每周的校外工作时间不超过 20 小时

有关校外工作时间的变更

根据临时公共政策,你可能有资格每周在校外工作超过 20 小时。

途径 2 - 省提名计划 (PNPS)

加拿大的省提名计划(PNPs)为有意移民到加拿大某一特定省份或地区的个人提供了获得加拿大永久居留权的 途径。加拿大每个省和地区都有自己的省提名计划,旨在满足其特定的经济和人口需求。

除魁北克省和努纳武特地区外,每个省都有多个 PNP 移民类别。这些类别由各省自行设计,以帮助实现其独特的移民目标,因此资格标准和申请程序各不相同。然而,PNP 是最受欢迎的选择,因为它是获得加拿大永久居留权的最便捷途径。

所有有关加拿大永久居留权的决定都必须由联邦政府在全国范围内批准,因此加拿大各省不能自行批准永久居民身份。这就是为什么省级计划被视为 "提名人"计划。



途径3-地区试点计划

农村和北部移民试点计划(RNIP)是一项由社区推动的计划,专为希望在参与计划的社区工作和生活的外国技术工人而设计。

RNIP 是由加拿大移民、难民和公民部制定的一项计划。它为合格的候选人提供了获得永久居留权的途径。这是一项由社区推动的计划。加拿大全国已有 11 个社区被选中参与该计划。竞争非常激烈。

RNIP 计划已延期至 2024 年 8 月。11 个参与社区中有 7 个社区的边界已经扩大。可在 [<u>此处</u>] 查看新的边界地图。

其他可考虑的途径

虽然获得加拿大永久居民身份(PR)的三大途径是快速通道(Express Entry)、省提名计划(PNPs)和地区 试点计划(Regional Pilot Programs),但还有其他一些选择可能与留学生相关。以下是其中几种:

快速通道中基于类别的选择

加拿大政府在其旗舰经济移民管理系统 "快速通道 "中引入了一项新程序,称为基于类别的甄选。这将允许加拿大向具有特定技能、培训或语言能力的未来永久居民发出申请邀请。今年,基于类别的甄选邀请将重点关注在以下领域具有较强法语能力或工作经验的候选人: 医疗保健、科学、技术、工程和数学(STEM)专业、手艺行当(如木匠、水管工和承包商)、运输、农业和农业食品。

哥伦比亚、海地和委内瑞拉公民获得永久居民PR身份的新途径

2023 年 10 月 10 日,IRCC 部长马克-米勒(Marc Miller)宣布从 2023 年秋季开始,为哥伦比亚、海地和委内瑞拉公民提供新的成为永久居民的途径。这一举措旨在帮助家庭团聚,并为那些在加拿大有家庭关系的人提供人道主义机会。

父母和祖父母担保(PGP)

虽然这一途径可能不会使学生直接受益,但可以为他们的父母或祖父母提供移民加拿大的选择。对于希望家人在身边的学生来说,这可能是一个重要因素。

请注意,在撰写本文时,尚未发布 2023 年专门针对留学生的移民途径。然而,许多国际学生都希望新的PR计划能够出台,以帮助他们克服由于COVID大流行和快速通道抽签暂停所带来的不利因素。

Language training

Schools often require this testing to ensure you will understand the content, material, and language spoken in the academic and professional setting. Common conversation language is very different from this, so preparing for this test is extremely helpful.

IELTS Related:

The sequence of modules in the IELTS exam has changed a bit, but the pattern remains the same. The sequence of the IELTS exam is as follows:

- For the paper-based IELTS, the sequence is Writing, Listening, and Reading.
- For the computer-based IELTS, the sequence is Listening, Reading, and Writing.

In both cases, the Speaking test may be scheduled up to a week before or after the other tests.

<u>Please verify this with the official IELTS resources or the test center for the most accurate information.</u>

Starting in March 2023, IELTS has introduced the One Skill Retake policy. Students will have the option to retake the IELTS for one component if their first score was below their target. This allows test takers to retake any one section of the test (Listening, Reading, Writing, or Speaking) if they need to improve on one area, instead of retaking all four sections. This is applicable for both IELTS Academic and General Training tests1.

However, to be eligible for the One Skill Retake, you must meet the following requirements:

- You have completed a full test at a center that offers IELTS One Skill Retake
- Your full test was an IELTS on computer test.
- You sit your IELTS One Skill Retake within 60 days of your full IELTS test.

<u>Please note that prices for the One Skill Retake may vary, so it's recommended to contact your local test center for more information. This policy is a great opportunity for students to reach their potential and showcase their full English language ability.</u>









IRCC Related:

Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) have announced that it will accept language test results from four new tests for Student Direct Stream (SDS) applicants. The newly eligible tests are:

- CELPIP General
- CAEL
- PTE Academic
- TOEFL iBT Test


This change will be effective from August 10, 2023. All test results must demonstrate abilities in speaking, listening, reading, and writing

Here are the minimum scores required for each test:

- <u>CELPIP General</u>: A score equivalent to a Canadian Language Benchmark of at least 7 in each of the four language-speaking abilities.
- CAEL and Pearson PTE Academic: A minimum score of 60.
- TOEFL iBT Test: A minimum score of 83.

Please note that students must take these tests in person. Online, remotely proctored tests will not be accepted for applicants in the SDS. Prior to this change, IELTS General and IELTS Academic were the only tests approved by IRCC for SDS applicants.

The SDS offers expedited processing of study permits for students from specific countries. There is a service standard of 20 days for all study permit applications eligible for SDS. This change is a significant development for international students aiming to study in Canada. Please verify this with the official IRCC resources or the test center for the most accurate information.





Get a SIN card In order to work in Canada, you need a Social Insurance Number (SIN). All international students should apply for one on arrival.

Here are the steps for international students to apply for a SIN in Canada:

Proof of Identity and Status in Canada:

You must provide a valid primary document that proves your identity and status in Canada. For international students, this could be a study permit that states you "may accept employment" or "may work" in Canada.

Students arriving at Toronto Pearson Airport during business hours may be able to get their Social Insurance Number (SIN) before leaving the airport. There is a Service Canada centre inside the airport, therefore no application will be required. you can fill out a form to obtain a new SIN, and you will receive your SIN on the spot within a few minutes. There is no fee to apply for a SIN. If you can't get your SIN at the airport, you can apply for one online, by mail, or in person at another Service Canada centre near you.

Application:

You can apply for a SIN in three ways:

- Online: You can <u>apply online</u>, upload your digital documents securely and, if eligible, view your SIN online once your application has been processed.
- In-Person: Visit the nearest Service Canada office. Remember to bring along your original documents.
- By Mail: If you live 100 kilometers or more from the nearest Service Canada office, you can send your application by mail.

Processing: After your application is processed, you will receive a SIN in a letter format.

Please note that due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the application process may have changed. It's always a good idea to check the official Service Canada website for the most current information.









Remember, your SIN is confidential and should be protected. Do not give it to anyone unless you confirm they are legally allowed to request it.

Work Culture

Canada is a wonderful place to live and a marvelous place to work! Everywhere you go, there is a significant difference in the workplace culture from the culture of the country you are working in. For this reason, it is very important to explain Canada's workplace culture and give you a list of practices and ways you should know and consider when deciding to work or when you are working in Canada.

Body language is vital in all cultures. You must hold yourself professionally and confidently; stand up straight, smile, etc. Body language gives a lasting impression and sets the tone for the workplace and future interactions. Having a bad first impression can lead to sourness and less fortunate outcomes.

Posture:

Standing up straight can convey confidence and professionalism. Slouching or hunching over can give the impression of low energy or disinterest.

Facial Expressions:

Smiling can indicate friendliness and approachability. However, it's important to ensure that your facial expressions are appropriate for the situation.

Handshake:

Traditionally, a firm handshake was seen as a sign of confidence and respect. However, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, many people are now using contactless greetings such as a nod, a wave, or an elbow bump. It's always a good idea to follow the most current public health guidelines and to respect the comfort levels of the people you're interacting with.

Eye Contact:

Maintaining appropriate eye contact during conversations can show that you are engaged and interested. However, it's important to avoid staring, which can make others uncomfortable.

Personal Space:

Respecting others' personal space is important. In Canada, it's customary to maintain a comfortable distance during conversations.

Remember, first impressions can have a lasting impact on how others perceive you. Demonstrating positive body language can help set a positive tone for future interactions. However, it's also important to be authentic and respectful of others' comfort levels.



Dressing to impress is very important in the Canadian workplace. Make sure you have done your research and know the dress code. When in doubt, business casual is often a go-to. There is a common saying in Canada, 'Dress for the job you want, not the job you have.' When dressing for work or an interview, it is common to avoid jeans and shorts and try to dress more conservatively. Always ensure your face and hair are clean and tidy. Lastly, avoid perfumes and extra fragrances. Often there are individuals allergic and thus most places say fragrance-free. Please note, that due to the trend towards remote work, many companies have adopted more relaxed dress codes, especially for employees working from home. However, it's always a good idea to clarify the dress code with your employer.



Personal Space

Personal space is huge in Canada, especially in the workplace. You can often get close for formal greetings or a handshake but afterward, keep your 6-foot distance when possible. Always be courteous and wash your hands accordingly. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, maintaining physical distance has become even more crucial. It's recommended to follow the most current public health guidelines regarding physical distancing.



Eye contact is often one of the hardest skills to master, however, it can be one of the most important. Having good eye contact shows trustworthiness and indicates interest while in conversation. It indicates personal confidence. There is a fine line though, between good eye contact and staring. Staring can make people uncomfortable. Remember to look away from time to time.

Eye Contact



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As mentioned before, a firm handshake can show your confidence and is a great way to show your intent. A handshake should be about 3-5 seconds, allowing for quick greetings and an introduction of your name. It is quick but effective. However, public health guidelines now recommend avoiding close contact with others, especially in a professional setting. Instead, many people are adopting alternative, contactless greetings such as a nod, a wave, or an elbow bump.



When first meeting someone, it is expected that you introduce yourself with your full name. You can often use Ma'am or Sir, however, you mustn't misgender them. You can always ask what they want to be referred to as. In Canadian workplaces, things are often more casual, and employees and management often talk on a first-name basis. When leaving and entering the workplace, it is customary to say hello and goodnight or good morning. It makes the workplace more relaxed and comforting. Please note, that due to the COVID-19 pandemic, many first meetings are now happening virtually. It's important to ensure that your video and audio are working properly and that you're in a quiet, well-lit space for these meetings.



Media Use

Social media is used by almost all individuals and companies here in Canada. Often companies use social media for job postings and to promote their products and services. However, there is a line between work use and personal use. It is important to only use work accounts for work activities during working hours. Remember to keep all personal social media time for personal hours; breaks, lunch, after-hours, etc. It is also common practice to not have your mobile device out in front of customers. Some businesses use social media like WhatsApp to have employee or management group chats. This helps switch shifts or need to call in sick. Always check your company's policies. With the rise of remote work, the use of social media and digital communication tools has become even more prevalent in the Canadian workplace. It's important to maintain a professional presence on these platforms, even when working from home.









It is very culturally common to have an open workplace. This means that employers will encourage you to ask questions and clarify things. If you do not understand or need assistance with something, you are strongly encouraged to seek help. Asking questions will decrease mistakes. It is an efficient and effective workplace cultural practice.

Workplaces have many values and etiquette that are standard across the board. Some of the following five are non-exhaustive but vital:

- <u>Kindness:</u> assist others when needed; saying please and thank you
- <u>Loyalty:</u> brands and companies love loyalty from their employees, support their products, and show passion for your brand, even off the clock; be an ambassador
- <u>Fairness</u>: treat all colleagues and clients with equality, do not assume anything; always treat people with respect, and always try to smile
- <u>Punctuality:</u> be on time for your shifts; it is customary to arrive 10-15 minutes early for your shift. This gives you time to settle, put your stuff away in the break room, and start work at the start time.
- <u>Courtesy:</u> Always be open with your colleagues and employers. If you are going to be late, call. If an emergency comes up, call. Employers are human and understand that life happens. Assist people when they need help, even open doors for others. Clean up after yourself and leave areas clean for the next colleague. Never make assumptions.
- <u>Adaptability:</u> With the rapid pace of change in today's workplace, being able to adapt to new situations and challenges is increasingly important.
- <u>Resilience:</u> The ability to bounce back from setbacks and keep going in the face of adversity is a valuable trait in the modern workplace.

Socializing

In Canadian workplace culture, being social and friendly with your colleagues is strongly encouraged. Teamwork, collaboration, team building, and morale-boosting can all be accomplished via socializing. Getting to know everyone can be an asset, just ensure you remain professional in the workplace and leave certain discussions away from customers or clients. More personal conversations can occur over breaks or when there are no customers around. Make sure clients and customers remain in priority over any conversation. It is also customary to avoid certain topics such as religion, politics, gossiping about others, and avoid foul language. The shift towards remote work has also impacted workplace culture. Many companies implementing initiatives to maintain a positive and inclusive culture in a virtual environment, such as virtual team-building activities and online social events.

Important Thing to Know

Everything you post online is visible to others, so think before you post. Twitter is for short microblogging, so keep content short and sweet. Have a key message and join the conversations. Most importantly, be authentic!

WHAT IS NETWORKING?

CANADIAN MANNERISMS TO EXPECT

- <u>Confident Body Language:</u> Show confident body language and smile often. This can help to alleviate stress and create a positive impression.
- <u>Adapt to Cultural Differences:</u> Canada is multicultural and has many ethnic cultures, each with their own mannerisms. Try to adapt to each person's style through observation. This practice is called mirroring.
- **Follow-Up:** Send a follow-up email or LinkedIn message within 24-48 hours to remind new connections who you are.
- **Express Gratitude:** Always say thank you. Canadians are known for being polite. Always remember to thank people for their time or hospitality.
- **Embrace Mistakes:** If you misspeak or fumble over words, don't worry. It's okay to laugh at yourself. We're all human.
- **Business Cards:** Have a few on hand during networking events. Make sure your business card is up-to-date and professionally designed.
- **<u>Dress Code:</u>** Dress appropriately for the occasion. In most professional settings, business casual is the norm.
- <u>Active Listening:</u> Show genuine interest in the other person. Ask thoughtful questions and listen attentively to their responses.
- **Networking Events:** Attend industry-specific events, seminars, and meetups. These are great opportunities to meet like-minded professionals and expand your network.
- <u>Volunteering:</u> Volunteering at events or organizations related to your field of interest can be a great way to meet people and demonstrate your commitment to the industry.



Banking

Having a bank account is crucial when you're studying in Canada. The process can sometimes be confusing and difficult if you do not have all the required documents and information for the bank right away. So we are here to help you! Most banks require the same documentation, so please make sure to have the following things ready:

- Your passport
- Your landing documents (IMM Form #1442 / 1208 / 1102) or Temporary Resident Visa (TRV)
- Proof of enrollment (optional, good-to-have)
- Social Insurance Number (SIN) or proof of residence (optional, good-to-have)
- Canadian VISA or Study Permit

There are a lot of banking options in Canada. You can do some initial research on opening a Canadian bank account by visiting the <u>Canadian Bankers Association (CBA)</u> website.

• TD has specific <u>International Student Bank Accounts</u> and Bundles designed with you in mind! They will help you set up the best bank account for your needs as a newcomer to Canada. When you apply for and participate in the TD International Student GIC Program, it can help you expedite your study permit application.

Royal Bank of Canada (RBC)

Build up your Canadian credit history

Building a good credit history in Canada is crucial for saving money on interest rates and getting approved more easily for things like cell phones, renting a house/apartment, lines of credit, car loans, housing mortgages, etc. It could even affect your ability to get hired for a job.

Using a credit card responsibly is a good way to build your credit history in Canada.

YOUR CREDIT REPORT

Your credit report is a summary of your credit history.

Your credit report is created when you borrow money or apply for credit for the first time. Lenders send information about your accounts to the credit bureaus, also known as credit reporting agencies.

YOUR CREDIT SCORE

Your credit score is a three-digit number that comes from the information in your credit report. It shows how well you manage credit and how risky it would be for a lender to lend you money. Your credit score is calculated using a formula based on your credit report.

Note that

- you get points if you use your credit responsibly
- you lose points if you have trouble managing your credit.

Your credit score will change over time as your credit report is updated.

WHY YOUR CREDIT HISTORY MATTERS

It can affect your finances

Financial institutions look at your credit report and credit score to decide if they will lend you money. They also use them to determine how much interest they will charge you to borrow money. If you have no credit history or poor credit history, it could be harder for you to get a credit card, loan, or mortgage. It could even affect your ability to rent a house or apartment or get hired for a job. If you have a good credit history, you may be able to get a lower interest rate on loans. This can save you a lot of money over time.

It can show signs of identity theft

You can also use your credit report to check for signs of identity theft. This is something you should do at least once a year for both credit bureaus. Look to make sure someone has not tried to open credit cards or other loans in your name.







ADDITIONAL BANKING PRACTICES FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Credit Card Usage:

Using credit cards responsibly is an important part of building a good credit history in Canada.
 Try to pay off the balance in full each month to avoid interest charges and maintain a good credit score.

Filing Taxes

Tax filing may seem quite daunting and confusing for those of you who adopt a different tax system in your home countries. However, it's an important part of living and working in Canada.

WHY SHOULD INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS FILE TAXES IN CANADA?

International students are encouraged to file taxes in Canada for several reasons:

- You may be eligible for tax credits such as the GST/HST credit, Trillium, and Tuition/Educational Credit.
- Filing taxes can save you money and you can receive a return for taxes paid while working in Canada.
- It helps you establish a tax history in Canada, which can be beneficial for future financial matters.



WHEN SHOULD YOU FILE YOUR TAXES?

In Canada, you generally have to file your income tax once a year. The 'Tax Season' begins in <u>late</u> <u>February and ends on April 30th</u>. This is for filing for the previous year.

You can file income tax anytime and even for previous years, however, it is encouraged that you file every year during the time frames given.

UNDERSTANDING TAXES IN CANADA FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Residency Status:

Your tax residency status in Canada depends on your connections to the country. These connections can include having a home in Canada, a spouse or partner living in Canada, or dependants in Canada. Other connections can also be considered, like owning property in Canada, having social or economic ties to Canada, holding a Canadian driver's licence or passport, or having health insurance with a Canadian province or territory.









Income from Abroad:

If you're a resident of Canada for tax purposes, you need to report income you earn from both inside and outside of Canada. If you worked in another country, your income tax return could be affected by a tax treaty between Canada and that country.

Tax Benefits and Credits:

Even if you don't have any income, it's a good idea to file a tax return. You might be eligible for tax benefits and credits, like the GST/HST credit, Trillium, and Tuition/Educational Credit. Most international students studying in Canada on a study permit are considered residents of Canada for income tax purposes.

Tax Filing Assistance:

Many universities offer tax clinics where volunteers help students file their taxes. Check if your university offers this service.

CRA MyAccount:

After you've filed at least one income tax return and received one notice of assessment, you can create a MyAccount on the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) website. This online service lets you manage your tax affairs and keep track of your correspondence with the CRA.

Remember, understanding your tax obligations and rights in Canada is important. If you're unsure about anything, don't hesitate to seek help from a tax professional or the CRA. It's always better to ask questions if you're not sure about something.

Accommodations

Finding a place to live is usually one of the first things you consider when moving to a new country. The price, location, commute time, and cost of living are all important factors to consider when deciding where to live. As an international student, you are likely to choose a location based on the location of your schools and career opportunities. There is a great multitude of options making it very important that you always weigh the pros and cons before making a decision. Below are some places to look when seeking housing as a newcomer.

1.SCHOOLS' INTERNATIONAL STUDENT SERVICES

One of the first steps as an international student to take is to contact your school of choice. Each school, more often than not, has an international student service or office. They are there to assist in all aspects of the process of attending their school. They will often have local resources and connections to assist in finding living accommodations. These services can also put you in contact with other international students coming to the school or that are already attending. These students can give invaluable information and advice for the entire process of moving to Canada. For more information specific to your school of choice, see the school's website or call your school directly.









2.SCHOOL RESIDENCE

Each post-secondary institution should have its residence options for students. This can sometimes be competitive to obtain, and can often be expensive, especially for international students. However, they do have their benefits; on-campus locations, access to 24hr security, and assistance. It is often easier to make friends and participate in classmate bonding activities! Each school is different and contacting your specific school is important. Some schools have specific housing options for international students, so it is worth investigating. Always remember to keep your budget in mind and weigh the pros and cons before making a final decision.

3.ROOMMATE-FINDING APPS

We live in a very tech-rich world, and there are now apps for your smart devices to help you with almost everything you can think of. One of these things includes finding roommates. These apps work like online dating, however, instead of finding love, it helps you find a roommate! There are many to choose from. HERE'S MORE INFORMATION ON THESE APPS

- Roomster: Roomster is a popular roommate-finding site. It has a large database of tenants and allows users to conduct quick background checks and connect social media accounts, which can provide a sense of security during the process. However, some users have mentioned that it's not very user-friendly and you have to pay to message.
- Roomi: Roomi works by matching you with potential roommates after you answer questions about yourself and what you're looking for in a roommate. It uses an algorithm to pair you with a roommate who is a good fit for you. Like Roomster, Roomi allows users to conduct quick background checks and connect social media accounts.
- Diggz: Diggz is a roommate finder app that uses a personalized search algorithm to match you with potential roommates1. You can express interest in roommate profiles that seem like a good fit, and if the interest is mutual, you'll be paired. Diggz also allows you to send an "Instant Message" to speed up the process. All profiles are vetted by Diggz to ensure a safe and scamfree platform. Diggz has received positive reviews and has helped many people find suitable rooms for rent.
- RoomEasy: RoomEasy is a roommate finder app that works similarly to Tinder. You create a profile on RoomEasy, add personal description tags from their system, and then search for roommates and apartments. You can "like" your favorite locations or potential roommates' profiles whenever you find anything that interests you, and if they "like" yours, you'll be paired.

Please note that while these apps can be helpful, it's important to exercise caution when meeting potential roommates online. Always meet in a public place first, and trust your instincts. If something doesn't feel right, it probably isn't. Also, be aware of potential scams, such as people asking for money before you've met or seen the apartment. It's always a good idea to see the apartment and meet the roommate in person before making any commitments.







4.FACEBOOK MARKETPLACE/ KIJIJI

A lot of individuals make postings on local marketplaces for places available for rent. This can sometimes be difficult if you are not yet in Canada. It can also be expensive, depending on the renter and the location. Making sure you are within your budget is important. Living alone can seem ideal for some, so this can be an option. If you plan on making more permanent living arrangements down the line and just need somewhere to stay temporarily, subletting a room or place for a short term can also be a beneficial option for you. This often gives you a fully furnished place to stay so it is less to worry about when you first arrive.

For most international students, your first accommodation will likely be a rental house or apartment. The <u>Canadian Mortgage & Housing Corporation (CMHC)</u> can help you learn information on your rights as a tenant in Canada.

ADDITIONAL TIPS FOR FINDING ACCOMMODATIONS IN CANADA

Understanding Lease Agreements:

Before you sign any lease agreement, make sure you understand all the terms and conditions. If there's anything you're unsure about, ask for clarification. It might also be helpful to have someone else, like a trusted friend or family member, review the agreement with you.

BEWARE OF RENTAL SCAMS IN CANADA

- 2. Hijacked Ads: Scammers copy legitimate rental listings and repost them with their own contact information.

Remember, when looking for a rental property, always verify the identity of the landlord or property manager, never send money without seeing the property first, and trust your instincts. If something doesn't feel right, it probably isn't.

- Negotiate: Don't be afraid to negotiate the price. Some landlords or property managers may be willing to lower the rent if you sign a longer lease.





Starting at CAD 40/month, you can get services like unlimited Canada-wide calling, unlimited local and international text messaging (SMS), caller ID, voicemail, and 10 GB data/month


Additional Tips for Getting a Canadian Phone Number

BEFORE LEAVING FOR CANADA








Finding the right Internet

In today's digital age, the internet is a part of pretty much EVERYTHING! So, choosing the right internet service provider is crucial. If you choose to live on campus or with a host family, they will most likely already have internet for you to use. Even coffee shops and many public places have free wifi or internet connections.



If you are setting up in a new place, you may have to set up your internet account. There are many options out there and it can be confusing if you do not know what you are looking for or if you do not know what you need. Here are a few options to look at. Please always do your research in your local area. Shopping locally can often get you the best deals!

Every internet provider will have seasonal deals and promotions, so always shop around and ask for deals! Sometimes calling a company and being very nice can get you great offers. There is no harm in being kind and asking. The following list of links can get you started. Remember to compare offers and your needs.

If you like streaming a lot of gaming for fun or have multiple devices connected, you may have different needs:

- <u>Bell</u>: Bell offers fiber, DSL, and wireless internet connections in several central and eastern provinces, including Ontario, Quebec, and Manitoba. The provider has various plans ranging from 10Mbps to 8Gbps speeds.
- <u>VirginPLUS</u>: Virgin Plus offers a number of telecom services in most provinces. Their mobility, cable and fiber internet and TV services keep Canada connected. Virgin Plus' 100Mbps Plan is a top pick, a great choice for families who want to stream movies, play online games, and work from home.
- <u>FIDO</u>: Fido provides basic cable internet service to Ontario, with prices low enough to make them a contender for one of the best internet service providers in the province.
- <u>EastLink</u>: Eastlink offers a number of telecom services in most provinces. Their mobility, cable and fiber internet and TV services keep Canada connected.
- <u>SunWire</u>: SunWire offers long-distance phone service, internet, and television services. Sunwire Internet is available through a number of affordable plans.







ADDITIONAL TIPS FOR FINDING THE RIGHT INTERNET IN 2023

Understand Your Needs:

The vast majority of people don't need IGB of upload or download speed. It's important to understand your internet usage habits. If you enjoy streaming a lot of games for fun, or have multiple devices connected, you may have different needs.

Check for Hidden Fees:

This means they can provide internet services without having to lay down their own cables or fiber to homes. The independent players must build an entire back-end infrastructure to run an ISP—but they don't have to run all the cable or fiber to homes. The benefits to Consumers are that these laws ultimately benefit the consumers by promoting competition among ISPs. This can lead to better service and pricing for consumers.

Get a driver's license

After you arrive in Canada, you may need to pass a written examination and one or two driving tests to obtain your Canadian driver's license. Each province has its own driving laws and rules.



HERE ARE THE GENERAL STEPS TO GET A DRIVER'S LICENSE IN CANADA:

Understand the Process:

The process to get a driver's licence in Canada depends on the province or territory where you live and on your driving background. It may include a written exam on the rules of the road and one or two driving tests.

Prepare for the Written Exam:

You can get a study guide to help with the written exam, which focuses on Canadian road rules.

Prepare for the Driving Test:

You may choose to pay for driving lessons to get ready for the driving tests.







International Driving Permit (IDP):

If you plan to use a foreign driver's licence in Canada, you should get an International Driving Permit (IDP) in your home country. An IDP will give you a translation of your licence into French and English.

Using an International Driver's License:

For a short time, new Canadian Permanent Residents can drive a car in their home province/territory using an international driver's license. It is strongly recommended that all international driver's license holders also carry an International Driving Permit (IDP) from their home country during this time.



OPTIONS FOR WORKING WHILE STUDYING







Work On-Campus

You can work on-campus without a work permit only if:

- You are a full time student at an eligible educational institution
- Your Study Permit says you Your study program is can work on- or offcampus
- You have already started studying
- · You have a Social Insurance Number (SIN)

Work-Off Campus

You can work off-campus without a work permit only if:

- You are a full time student at a designated learning institution (DLI)
- minimum 6 months and leads to a degree, diploma or certificate
- Your Study Permit says you can work off-campus
- You have a Social Insurance Number (SIN)
- There is no longer a limit of 20 hours per week off-campus while class is in session from November 15, 2022, to December 31, 2023

Co-op or Internships

You can apply for a co-op work permit if:

- You have a valid study permit
- The co-op or internship placement is required to complete your study program
- You have a letter from your school that confirms all students in your program need to complete work placements to graduate
- The co-op or internship totals 50% or less of your study program

2.VOYAGERS' SECOND MILESTONE: GRADUATE

ConGRADulations, Voyager! You did it! Now, You might be wondering about your next steps after graduating. Fret not. Your Captains are here to guide you in your journey. The following are the possible options available after completing your study program.

Within 180 days of receiving your completion letter or final transcripts, there are two possible options:

- 1. Leave Canada:
 - a. Must stop working immediately
 - b. Must leave within 180 days (even if the study permit is still valid)
- 2. Stay In Canada:
 - a. Be accepted to a new study program or...
 - b. Apply for a work permit (if you want to keep working) or...
 - c.Change to visitor status

Wondering if you can continue working after graduating?

We've got the solution for you... Post Graduate Work Permit!

You must stop working upon program completion unless you meet all of the following criteria:

- You have applied for a PGWP
- Your Study Permit was valid when you applied for your PGWP
- · Must stop working if the PGWP application is refused

In addition, starting from April 6, 2023, international graduates with a recently expired or expiring post-graduation work permit (PGWP) will qualify for an additional or extended work permit to stay longer and gain additional work experience for up to 18 months.

POST-GRADUATION WORK PERMIT (PGWP) PROGRAM

This program allows international graduates to obtain an open work permit to gain valuable Canadian work experience. Starting April 6, 2023, PGWP holders who wish to stay longer can opt in to a facilitative process to extend their work permit.

APPLICATION TIMELINE

Graduates must apply for a PGWP within 180 days of receiving their final grades from the institution. The study permit must have been valid at some time during these 180 days to be eligible for a PGWP.

DURATION OF THE PROGRAM

The length of the PGWP depends on the length of the study program. If the program was less than 8 months, the student might not be eligible for a PGWP. If the program was at least 8 months but less than 2 years, the PGWP might be valid for the same length as the study program. For a program that was 2 years or more, the PGWP might be issued for 3 years.









ONLINE STUDIES

The time spent studying online before December 31, 2023, won't be deducted from the length of the PGWP as long as it constitutes less than 50% of the program of study.

NEW RULES

Starting from December 1, 2023, post-secondary designated learning institutions (DLI) will be required to confirm every applicant's letter of acceptance directly with IRCC. This new, enhanced verification process aims to protect prospective students from letter-of-acceptance fraud.

FUTURE PLANS

In the coming months, IRCC will complete an assessment of Post-Graduation Work Permit Program criteria and begin introducing reforms to better calibrate it to meet the needs of the Canadian labour market, as well as regional and Francophone immigration goals.

3.VOYAGERS' THIRD MILESTONE: PGWP

After successfully completing their study program in Canada, students are permitted to work. The Captains at Voyagers are here to assist and guide you on your career path. <u>Join the Voyagers family</u> and start figuring out your career in Canada today.

What is PGWP?

The Post-Graduation Work Permit (PGWP) is an open work permit that allows you to gain Canadian work experience. This experience can support your Permanent Residency (PR) application if your experience falls under NOC 0, A, or B categories. Please note that the PGWP is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity and is not renewable.

Validity of PGWP

The validity of the PGWP depends on the length of your study program:

- If your program was less than 8 months, you are not eligible for PGWP.
- If your program was between 8 months and 2 years, the PGWP would be valid for the same length as your study program.
- If your program was 2 years or longer, the PGWP would be valid for 3 years.

Please note that a work permit cannot be issued for a period longer than the validity of your passport.

Eligibility for PGWP

To qualify for the PGWP, you must:

- Successfully complete an eligible program at an eligible designated learning institution.
- Study full-time at the institution.
- Not take unscheduled breaks or unauthorized leave.
- Not exceed the allowable hours of off-campus work.
- Apply within 180 days of receiving a letter of completion or final transcript from your school.

APPLYING FOR A POST-GRADUATION WORK PERMIT (PGWP) IN CANADA

If you're studying in Canada or about to finish your schooling, follow these steps to apply for a PGWP:

1. CHECK YOUR ELIGIBILITY

You must have completed a program of study that lasted at least eight months and that led to a degree, diploma, or certificate.

2. APPLY WITHIN THE RIGHT TIMEFRAME

You must apply for a PGWP within 180 days of receiving written confirmation (for example, a transcript or an official letter) from your school that you have met the requirements for completing your academic program. You can apply for a PGWP from inside Canada or from another country.

3. MAINTAIN YOUR STATUS

If your study permit will expire before you apply for a PGWP and you wish to stay in Canada, you must apply to change your status to a visitor. If your study permit expires before you apply for a PGWP, you have up to 90 days after your study permit expires to apply for a PGWP and restore your status as a student.

4. PREPARE YOUR DOCUMENTS

When you apply, you must show that you have completed your program of study. You can confirm this by submitting any of the following: your degree or diploma, your transcript, or an official letter from your school.

5. SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION

You can apply for a PGWP online. You must pay the correct fee (C\$255) and, if you need to restore your status as a student, an additional fee (C\$350).

6. WAIT FOR APPROVAL

You can work full-time while waiting for a decision on your <u>post-graduation work permit (PGWP)</u> application if, at the time you submit your application, all of the following apply to your situation:

- You had a valid study permit.
- You have completed your program of study.
- You were eligible to work off campus without a permit.
- You did not work off-campus more than 20 hours a week during academic sessions.

Changes to off-campus work hours

You may be eligible to work more than 20 hours per week off campus under a temporary public policy. Please check https://www.canada.ca/en/immigration-refugees-citizenship/services/study-canada/work/work-off-campus.html#off-campus for details.

7. EXTEND YOUR STAY

Starting from April 6, 2023, international graduates with a recently expired or expiring PGWP will qualify for an additional or extended work permit to stay longer and gain additional work experience for up to 18 months.

4.VOYAGERS' FOURTH MILESTONE: PATHWAYS TO PR

Choosing a PR program that best fits your profile is one of the most important milestones in your path to Canadian Citizenship. It can feel daunting to choose the right program. That's where your Captains at Voyagers are always ready to support and guide you through your PR journey.

PATHWAY NO.1- EXPRESS ENTRY

Express Entry is a point-based system with a maximum of 1200 points. Important factors of consideration include:

- Age
- Language abilities
- Work experience (Foreign + Canadian)
- Other factors (family in Canada, etc.)

The Express Entry system is responsive to Canada's changing economic and labor market needs. The Express Entry program delivery instructions have been updated to reflect the changes to section 11.2 and to instruct officers on how to assess Express Entry category-based selection applications where the principal applicant was invited by virtue of their membership in a category.

PATHWAY NO.2 - PROVINCIAL NOMINEE PROGRAMS (PNPS)

Canada's provincial nominee programs (PNPs) offer a pathway to Canadian permanent residence for individuals who are interested in immigrating to a specific Canadian province or territory. Each Canadian province and territory operates its own PNP designed to meet its specific economic and demographic needs.

Each province, apart from Quebec and Nunavut, operates several PNP streams. These streams are designed by the provinces to help meet their unique immigration goals, so the eligibility criteria and application procedures vary. However, PNPs are a popular option because they can be the easiest pathway to Canadian permanent residence.

All decisions regarding Canadian permanent residence must be approved at the national level by the federal government, so Canada's provinces cannot approve permanent resident status on their own. This is why the provincial programs are considered "nominee" programs.

PATHWAY NO.3 - REGIONAL PILOT PROGRAMS

The Rural & Northern Immigration Pilot Program (RNIP) is a community-driven program designed for skilled foreign workers who want to work and live in one of the participating communities.

The RNIP is a program created by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada. It provides a pathway to permanent residency for qualified candidates. It is a community-driven initiative. 11 communities across Canada have been selected to participate. It is very competitive.

The RNIP has been extended to August 2024. The boundaries for seven of the 11 participating communities have been expanded. Maps of the new boundaries are available [here].







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ADDITIONAL PATHWAYS TO CONSIDER

While the three main pathways to Permanent Residency (PR) in Canada are Express Entry, Provincial Nominee Programs (PNPs), and Regional Pilot Programs, there are several other options that could be relevant for international students. Here are a few:

CATEGORY-BASED SELECTION IN EXPRESS ENTRY

The Government of Canada has introduced a new process called category-based selection for Canada's flagship economic immigration management system, Express Entry. This will allow Canada to issue invitations to apply to prospective permanent residents with specific skills, training or language ability. This year, category-based selection invitations will focus on candidates who have a strong French language proficiency or work experience in the following fields: healthcare, science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) professions, trades (such as carpenters, plumbers, and contractors), transport, agriculture, and agri-food.

NEW PR PATHWAY FOR CITIZENS OF COLOMBIA, HAITI, AND VENEZUELA

On October 10, 2023, IRCC Minister Marc Miller announced a New PR Pathway for citizens of Colombia, Haiti, and Venezuela, starting in the fall of 2023. This initiative aims to reunite families and provide a humanitarian opportunity for those with extended family ties in Canada.

PARENTS AND GRANDPARENTS SPONSORSHIP (PGP)

While this pathway may not directly benefit the students, it could be an option for their parents or grandparents to immigrate to Canada. This could be a significant factor for students who wish to have their family close by.

Please note that at the time of writing, no immigration pathways specific to international students have been released in 2023. However, many international students are hopeful that new PR programs will be released to help overcome the disadvantages they have experienced due to the COVID pandemic and pauses in Express Entry draws.

IMPORTANT UPDATES FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS IN CANADA

ENHANCED VERIFICATION PROCESS:

Starting December 1, 2023, post-secondary designated learning institutions (DLI) will be required to confirm every applicant's letter of acceptance directly with IRCC. This new process aims to protect prospective students from letter-of-acceptance fraud and to help them avoid similar problems that some students faced earlier this year as a result of fraud investigations. It will also ensure that study permits are issued based only on genuine letters of acceptance.

RECOGNIZED INSTITUTION FRAMEWORK:

In time for the fall 2024 semester, IRCC will adopt a "recognized institution" framework to benefit post-secondary DLIs that set a higher standard for services, support and outcomes for







international students. These DLIs will benefit, for example, from the priority processing of study permits for applicants who plan to attend their school.

REFORMS TO POST-GRADUATION WORK PERMIT PROGRAM:

In the coming months, IRCC will complete an assessment of Post-Graduation Work Permit Program criteria and begin introducing reforms to better calibrate it to meet the needs of the Canadian labour market, as well as regional and Francophone immigration goals.

UNDERSTANDING IMMIGRATION PATHWAYS TO CANADA

EXPRESS ENTRY SYSTEM

The Express Entry system is a federal immigration program set up by the Canadian Federal Government.

- It includes three immigration programs designed to provide permanent residence for skilled foreign immigrants: Federal Skilled Worker Program, Federal Skilled Trades Program, and Canadian Experience Class.
- This system is point-based, awarding points to applicants based on criteria such as age, education, and work experience.
- The system holds regular draws from which qualified applicants are selected through a variety of Federal Economic Immigration programs and invited to apply for permanent residence.
- This system is appealing because it speeds up the whole process, meaning that you could be on your way to Canada in as little as six months' time from your date of application.

PROVINCIAL NOMINEE PROGRAM (PNP)

The PNP system refers to a set of immigration programs created and operated by Canada's various provinces and territories.

- These provinces and territories have made immigration agreements with the Federal Government to help them attract foreign workers who can join their workforce and help grow their local economy.
- There are currently over 80 provincial nominee programs. Most of these are designed to bring in foreigners who meet the province or territory requirements.
- Applying for a PNP means applying for a provincial nomination before applying for PR.
- The main difference between the Express Entry System and the PNP is the way applicants are selected.

WHY PERMANENT RESIDENCY?

SAME RIGHTS AS CANADIAN CITIZENS:

As a permanent resident, you have most of the same rights and responsibilities as a Canadian citizen.







PR FOR FAMILY MEMBERS:

You can sponsor eligible family members to come to Canada.

INCREASED MOBILITY:

You can live, work or study anywhere in Canada, and travel in and out of the country.

ACCESS TO CREDIT:

With a good credit history, permanent residents may find it easier to get loans (like a mortgage) and credit cards.

PATHWAY TO CANADIAN CITIZENSHIP:

Permanent residency is the first step towards becoming a Canadian citizen.

In addition, the Canadian government has set ambitious immigration targets for the coming years. In total, Canada aims to admit 465,000 PRs by 2023, 485,000 by 2024, and 500,000 by 2025. This includes a significant number of skilled workers through the Federal High Skilled Category and the Provincial Nominee Programme.
